

On August 6th all parishioners are invited to join in the First Friday Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. According to this devotion, the first Friday of each month was designated by Jesus himself as consecrated to honoring his Sacred Heart, to increase our love for him and to make reparation for past and present offenses against his love. The Church grants a Plenary indulgence to those who attend Mass and receive communion in honor of The Sacred Heart on the First Friday of each month for 9 consecutive months. After the daily Mass on Thursday (this can be the first Thursday or last Thursday of the month) before First Friday, there will be an exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and a Holy Hour will follow, with confession during the Holy Hour. Before the final blessing, on First Friday, the Act of Consecration to the Sacred Heart is recited. Pamphlets are available in the entry to the Church explaining this devotion, along with the First Saturday Devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Please join us during this special time in prayer.
