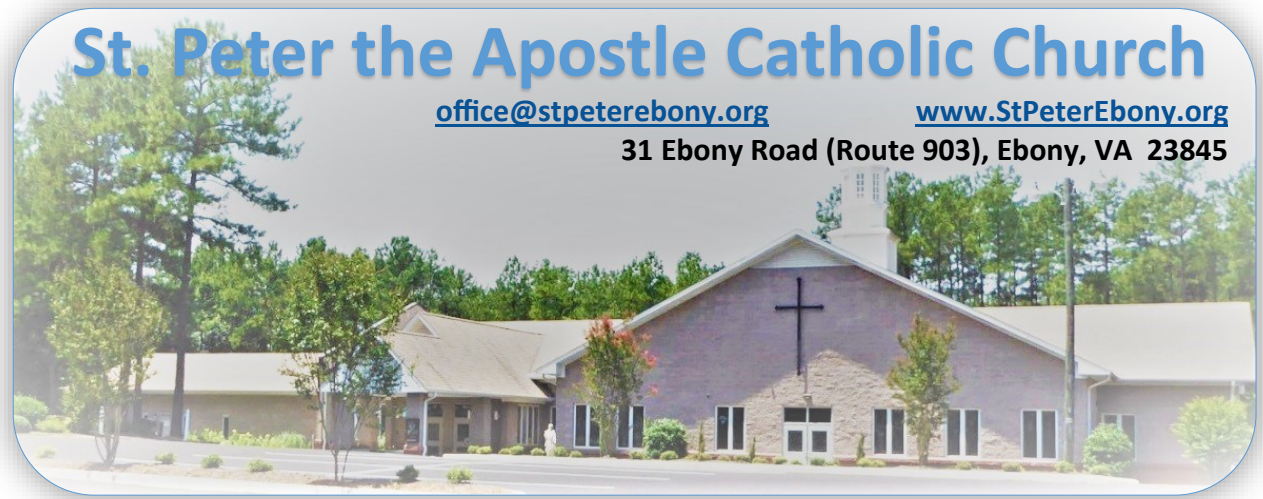

Study of the Readings

Focusing the Gospel

Key words & phrases:

hear my voice, follow me, eternal life, no one can take them out of my hand

To the point:

Our being “sheep” does not mean that we blindly follow Jesus, but that we actively pursue a relationship with him by hearing his voice and heeding his words. Although following the Good Shepherd truly leads to eternal life, the

way of discipleship is not easy. However, nothing can interfere with Jesus’ care for us: we are secure in his hands. We are never alone for he is the good Shepherd.

Connecting the Gospel ...

... to the First Reading:

Jesus is both the Good Shepherd (Gospel) and the Lamb who was slain (Second Reading). As shepherd, Jesus is the one who cares for us and leads us even when we face

jealousy, abuse, and rejection (First Reading). As lamb, Jesus is the one who lays down his life in sacrifice for us.

... to experience:

The tumult of the world is not a sign that God has abandoned us. Jealousy, violent abuse, persecution, expulsions, etc. have always been part of our human condition. In all of this, Jesus will shepherd us, lead us to “springs of life-giving water,” and “wipe away every tear” (Second Reading).

How do we hear Jesus’s voice today? Certainly through Scripture, especially the Gospel proclaimed at Mass. We can also say that we hear Jesus’s voice in times of silent prayer, or maybe echoing through the witnesses of the saints or the cries of the poor. One other way that we hear Christ’s voice is in the Church, the community of believers who make up Jesus’s body. If it’s true that Christ is present where “two or three are gathered in my name,” then the Church is an important place where we can encounter Christ’s voice in our own lives. This can transform the way we look at our Church—and how we respond to the Church community and our leaders. How, for instance, does the fact that Christ speaks through His Church change the way we think about our Annual Diocesan Appeal? It’s easy to think of the Church as just another non-profit, and the Appeal as just another fundraiser. But it’s not. It’s a request from the Body of Christ to all the faithful to aid in our important work of building the Kingdom of God, here in our local community. Ask for the grace to hear Christ’s voice in our Annual Diocesan Appeal, and see how He moves you to give.
