

### Study of the Readings

#### Background on the Gospel Reading Matthew 5:1-12a

Today's reading is the beginning of Jesus' Sermon on the Mount, which is found in Matthew's Gospel. The form of the Beatitudes found here is not unique to Jesus. Forty days after the birth of Jesus Christ, on February 2nd, we celebrate the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord. This was the event in which Our Lady followed Jewish custom and went to the Temple in Jerusalem to present her Son to God. At the Presentation, St. Simeon took the baby Jesus into his arms and prayed to God, saying: "Now Master, you may let your servant go in peace, according to your word, for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you prepared in sight of all the peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel."-Luke 2:29-32

On the Feast of the Presentation, honor Jesus' coming by bringing candles to Mass to be blessed and to honor Christ as the "Light of the World." Today Jesus said in the Gospel, "Rejoice and be glad, for your reward will be great in heaven." (Matthew 5:12) He commanded us to rejoice in our persecution. Jesus doesn't ask us to rejoice in pain for pain's sake. As he faced his agony, Jesus himself asked that the cup of suffering "might pass from me." Jesus shares our very human and very good desire to avoid pain when it makes sense to do so. He commanded us to rejoice when in pain for his sake. "If they persecuted me, they will also persecute you," he candidly reminded those following him (John 15:20). Pain comes to those who follow him. That's the bad news. The good news is it will eventually be okay-more than OK. We will possess him in perfect beatitude one day. It's worth anything this valley of tears can throw at us because the valley has an end.
