

Background on the Gospel **Reading** Matthew 18:15-20

Today's Gospel is taken from a chapter of Matthew's Gospel, which is sometimes called the "discourse on the Church". Here, Jesus speaks more directly about matters of Church discipline and order. In today's reading we find one of only three instances in which Jesus uses the word church in Matthew's Gospel. In Matthew's record of Jesus' teaching. we can hear echoes of the kinds of issues faced by the early Christian community.
