Background on the Gospel **Reading** Mark 1:14-20

The Gospel of Mark does not begin with Jesus' birth but on the preaching of John the Baptist. John is described as the voice in the wilderness sent to prepare the way of the Lord. Immediately after describing the work of John, Mark reports on Jesus' baptism and his temptation in the desert. Jesus' public ministry begins after the arrest of John. Mark wants his readers to understand the important connection between the end of the ministry of John the Baptist and the beginning of Jesus' ministry.
