

## Study of the Readings

### Background on the Gospel Reading Luke 24:35-48

We continue to hear Gospel accounts of Jesus' appearances to his disciples following his Resurrection. Today's reading follows the report of Jesus' appearance to his disciples on the road to Emmaus. This is the event being recounted by the disciples in the opening verse. Consistently in the reports of Jesus' post-Resurrection Jesus greets his appearances, disciples with the words, "Peace be with you." This is a most appropriate greeting. The disciples have witnessed the death of someone they loved, and they now fear for their own lives. Peace is what they need more than anything else. Jesus often connects this greeting
