

Background on the Gospel **Reading** John 15:9-17

Today's Gospel follows immediately after last week's Gospel in which Jesus taught that he was the vine and that his disciples were the branches. We learned that our union with Jesus will lead to fruitful service. Today's reading extends this teaching to describe the kind of service that Christians are called upon to offer to others. We hear Jesus affirm that he is known by the Father and that his disciples will know the Father by knowing Jesus. In this passage, however, Jesus reminds his disciples that this knowledge is to be expressed in love. Those who know Jesus well-and Jesus says that his disciples do know him-will love one another. Knowledge leads to love, which
