

Study of the Readings

Background on the Gospel **Reading** John 6:1-15

In John's Gospel, Jesus' multiplication of the loaves and the fishes is presented as a sign of his authority and divinity. Jesus interprets the meaning and significance of this miracle as a sharing of his Body and Blood. This chapter is sometimes called the "Bread of Life Discourse." John's Gospel uses this miracle to teach about the Eucharist. Like the Last Supper, this miracle is said to have occurred near the time of the Jewish feast of Passover. Jesus' language is similar to the language he used at the Last Supper as reported in Synoptic Gospels. John's description of this event also

reminds us that God feeds and Eucharist.
