

In the dialogue between Jesus and the crowds, Jesus unfolds the gift of himself that he gives in the Eucharist. There are four exchanges between Jesus and the crowd. First, they asks, "Rabbi, when did you get here?" Jesus replies by naming their motivation in pursuing him. They have been fed.
