



Study of the Readings

Background on the Gospel Reading Mark 8:27-35

Today's reading is the turning point in Mark's Gospel. In the presentation of the life and ministry of Jesus in the Gospel of Mark, the deeds of Jesus have shown Him to be the Son of God. Yet many, including Jesus' disciples, have not realized his identity. Jesus asks the disciples for a field report by asking what others say about him. He then turns the question directly to the disciples and asks what they believe. Peter speaks for all of them when he announces that they believe Jesus to be the Christ. The word Christ is the Greek translation of the Hebrew word for Messiah, which means "the anointed one." At the time of Jesus,
