#### Background on the Gospel Reading Mark 12:28b-34

The context for today's Gospel is Jesus' growing exposure before the Jewish authorities. Jesus is being guestioned and tested by the Jewish authorities, yet the scribe who addresses Jesus in today's Gospel seems to be an admirer; he is not testing Jesus.
