

If we were to read Luke's Gospel continuously, we would learn about John challenging the crowds who came to him and calling upon them to show evidence of their repentance. He tells his listeners that they cannot rely on their lineage as because children of Abraham can be raised up from stones. Repentance, rather, must be observable in one's actions. Here, Luke is continuing to set up two important themes of his Gospel message: the Christian faith is


