






Study of the Readings

Background on the Gospel Reading Luke 1:39-45

On the last Sunday before Christmas. our Gospel reading prepares us to witness Christ's birth by showing us how Jesus was recognized as Israel's long-awaited Messiah even before his birth. The Gospel turns our attention from the ministry of John the Baptist to the events that preceded John the Baptist's birth. The story of John the Baptist and his parents, Elizabeth and Zechariah, are reported only in Luke's Gospel. Luke pairs the birth of John the Baptist and Jesus, establishing John's early connection to the Messiah. The Gospel recalls Mary's actions after the announcement of Jesus' birth by the angel Gabriel.


