Study of the Readings

Background on the Gospel Reading Luke 2:22-40

Today the Church celebrates the Feast of the Presentation of Jesus in the temple. The Presentation, which is celebrated 40 days after Christmas, is not mentioned in the other Gospels. Only Luke tells the story, most likely because he writes for Gentile Christians who are not familiar with the Jewish rite of presentation and purification. In addition, the intent of Luke's Gospel is to show that God's Jesus, extends to Gentiles.

Praying With Next Week's Readings


Reading I: Isaiah 6:1-2a, 3-8 Responsorial Psalm: 138:1-5, 7-8

Reading II: 1 Corinthians 15:1-11

Gospel: Luke 5:1-11

Luke recognizes Joseph and the Gentiles, and glory for your Mary as faithful Jews who bring people Jesus to the Temple in recognized Jerusalem. Here they present fulfillment of the promise of their firstborn son to the Lord. redemption and spoke about him Jesus is thus consecrated as to all. required by the Law of Moses. Present in the temple at this time are Simeon and Anna. Both are awaiting the restoration of God's rule in Israel. Simeon had been promised by the Holy Spirit that he would see Christ the Lord, the Messiah, before he died. The holy man immediately recognized promise to Israel, fulfilled in the infant Jesus as the promised Savior, a "light for revelation to
