

Today's Gospel is the beginning of what is called the Sermon on the Plain. We find a parallel to this passage in Matthew 5:1-7,11 that is called the Sermon on the Mount. There are differences and similarities between these gospel readings. When spoken from the mountaintop in Matthew's Gospel, the impression is that Jesus is speaking with the authority and voice of God. The mountaintop is a symbol of closeness to God.
