



### Background on the Gospel **Reading** Luke 6:27-38

Today's Gospel is a continuation of the teaching that began in last Sunday's gospel, Jesus' Sermon on the Plain, which is addressed to Jesus' disciples. These words from Jesus' teaching are familiar to us. They constitute the crux and the challenge of what it means to be a disciple: Love your enemies, turn the other cheek, give to those who ask, do unto others, lend without expecting repayment, judge not lest you be judged. There are several similarities between Luke's and Matthew's report of Jesus' great teaching. Both begin with


