

# Study of the Readings

### Background on the Gospel **Reading** Luke 9:28b-36

The Transfiguration occurs on a mountain in the presence of three of Jesus' disciples-Peter, James and John. Only Luke's Gospel, which often describes Jesus at prayer, indicates that Jesus is praying as his appearance changes to bright white. The three disciples were sleeping while Jesus prayed. They will be sleeping again as Jesus prays in the Garden of Gethsemane before his Passion and death. As they awake, Peter and the disciples see Jesus Transfigured and Elijah and Moses present with Jesus. Elijah and Moses, both significant figures in the history of Israel, represent Jesus' continuity
