




# Fifth Sunday of Lent—April 6, 2025

### Study of the Readings

#### Background on the Gospel **Reading** John 8:1-11

Today's Gospel continues to offer lessons about God's mercy and forgiveness. It begins by reporting that Jesus is again teaching the crowds in the vicinity of the Temple. The scribes and the Pharisees approach Jesus, bringing a woman who has been caught in the act of adultery. They put to Jesus the question of what ought to be done in this case. The Pharisees state clearly that according to the Law of Moses, those caught in the act of adultery were to be stoned to death. Under Roman occupation, however, the Jewish people did not have the authority to execute people. To answer the Pharisees' question,
